# From the Pastor's Desk

### Minister Rev. Tommy Willcockson

The holiday season—what a wonderful time of year for Christians. We celebrate family and friends and the coming New Year with all its possibilities. Most of all, our focus is on the gift of the Christ child during this season. Parties and dinners and gatherings for family and friends. Special church services. Shopping and giving gifts. Of course all this is supposed to be done with a smile on our faces and a spring in our steps.

The most of us, there is some ambivalence or even a bit of dread mixed in with the joy of spending time with family. Then there is the parking and the traffic and the crowds. Not to mention limited time and energy and money as we juggle schedules and budgets and effort.

Even the fun things shake up our routines and we often "take a break" from the more-healthy habits we practice the rest of the year. We may wind up eating and drinking too much, exercising too little, and forgoing healthy down time—even opportunities for prayer and meditation. It is great to give, but in an effort to please others or even buy happiness, we may spend more money than we should.

Wow, for a wonderful time of year, it seems there can be significant stress and pressure mixed in with the pure joy of the season, huh? No wonder some of us come off tike the Grinch or Ebenezer Scrooge.

If you think the holidays can be tough for everyone else, for those of us already dealing with depression or loneliness—or having experienced the loss of a loved one this year—the holidays can be an especially difficult time.

There are some things we CAN do to increase our happiness and joy as we minimize the likelihood that our inner-Scrooge will take over.

This list was adapted from a list on the PBS homepage:

Take care of yourself. Just because you are going to parties and gatherings it doesn't mean that you have to throw all healthy behaviors out the window. Try to stay consistent with your exercise schedule and sleep patterns (assuming they are healthy ones!)

Evaluate "obligations." Just because it is something you have always done or a place you have always gone to doesn't mean you have to do it this year. It is okay to say no. "No" can actually be a complete sentence. Consider it part of your personal health care plan.

Spirituality. Focus on the spiritual aspects of the holidays versus the commercial ones. What do the holidays mean to your faith and your relationship to God?

Family. There is a lot of pressure to spend time with family, gathered around a lovely table smiling, and sharing warm memories! Not everyone has those kinds of family experiences. Spend time with people you enjoy. Remember that friends can be the family you choose.

Create your own traditions that work for you! It may be going away during the holidays or spending time volunteering to help others. Volunteering at a shelter or hospital or other helping organization can be personally fulfilling and makes a great excuse for avoiding stressful gatherings.

In spite of their ultimate meaning, Christmas, Thanksgiving, and New Year are "just another day" and we have 365 opportunities in a year to make a day special and meaningful to ourselves, our families, our friends and our faith.

<u>Reminder:</u> As you travel throughout the year, please remember to collect small hotel-sized toiletry items (especially shampoos, body wash and lotions) to support Zion's ministry with the Oak Ridge unit at the Beaumont Juvenile Correctional Center. These items are used as prizes when Zion visits and plays bingo with the teenage boys there a couple of times a year.
